

## Parents/Spectators Code of Conduct

- If children are interested, encourage them to play sport. However do not force them.
- Children play organised sport for fun. They are not playing for your entertainment and are not miniature professionals.
- Focus upon the child's efforts and performance rather than the overall outcome of the game.
- Assist the children in setting realistic goals relating to her ability by reducing the emphasis on winning.
- Teach your children that an honest effort is more important than a victory.
- Encourage them to always play according to the rules and the officials decision.
- **NEVER** ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a game.
- Remember children learn best from example, applaud good play by both teams.
- If you disagree with an umpire, raise the issue through appropriate channels rather than question the umpires judgement and honesty in public remember umpires give their 'free' time and effort for your child's chosen sport.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from the game.
- Show respect for your teams opponents. Without them, there would be no game.
- Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour by not using foul language, harassing players, coaches or umpires.
- **DO NOT** give the young umpires a hard time, if your daughter is in the U12 or older she will have to umpire treat umpires as you want your daughter to be treated.
- Adhere to all Covid requirements. This is vital to keeping our competition going.
